INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE JURISPRUDENCE EXAM

The examination is an open-book, un-timed test. The exam is meant to assist you in understanding the board's regulations, including statute and rule. In addition, the examination will provide you with initial insight into where to find answers you may seek as a licensee of the board.

The goal of the examination is to familiarize you with the Board's regulations and to have you know where to look when you are searching for answers during your professional life. You will find answers in either division regulations, which apply to all boards, or in Board regulations which are specific to the dental profession. You will need to look in both statute and rule for the answers to these questions.

Board staff may not send you the statutes and rules for this exam, as we are not the official record keeper, the Secretary of State's office is, but we do provide a link to the official website to assist you.

Access the statutes and rules on the board's website at www.dentistry.mt.gov

- 1. Click on the "Regulations" tab
- 2. Select either "Administrative Rules" or "Statutes," you will use both.
 - a. You can combine the rules only into a readable/searchable book by following the steps below for each Chapter 138 and 101:
 - i. Select Administrative Rules
 - ii. Click on the chapter you wish to make an electronic book
 - 1. Select "View as eBook"
 - 2. Click on the words next to the star on the next screen
 - 3. Click on "Printer Friendly Version:
 - a. Save the document as you see fit
 - i. To search Select "Control" "F" (on your keyboard) and type in a word.
