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Licensing Requirements and Application Checklist Speech-Language Pathologist (not currently licensed out-of-state)

<u>License Requirements for Speech-Language Pathologist (not currently licensed out-of-state)</u> Below are the minimum requirements you must meet to be licensed in the state of Montana.

- 1. Minimum of a master's degree in speech-language pathology or communication disorders from a program accredited by the Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association. During this program you must have completed a supervised clinical practicum experience [MCA 37-15-303, ARM 24.222.502(2)(a) & (b)]
- 2. Pass the national PRAXIS exam [MCA 37-15-303, ARM 24.222.502(2)(d), 24.222.510(1)(a)]
- 3. Pass the open-book state jurisprudence examination which is included with the application. A passing score is 80% or greater [MCA 37-15-303, ARM 24.222.502(2)(d), 24.222.510(1)(b) and (2)]
- 4. Completion of a 36-week speech language pathology supervised professional experience as described in ARM 24.222.509 MCA 37-15-303, ARM 24.222.502(2)(c)].

<u>Checklist of Required Documents to Submit for Application for Speech-Language Pathologist</u> (not currently licensed out-of-state)

The following documents and additional forms are required <u>in addition</u> to the basic application. Some documents may be submitted directly by the applicant as part of the application. Others, such as transcripts, may need to be sent to the board directly from the source.

Applicants WITH a current certificate of clinical competence from ASHA must submit the following documents.
