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Licensing Requirements and Application Checklist Architect by Credentialing

License Requirements for an Architect by Credentialing License:

Below are the minimum requirements you must meet in order to be licensed in the state of Montana.

1. Applicants holding valid licensure to practice architecture in another state or jurisdiction shall: [[ARM 24.114.503](#), [37-1-304](#), [MCA](#)]
 - a. submit to the board a completed application, on forms prescribed by the board, including all required fees and documentation;
 - b. present proof the applicant is the holder of an NCARB certificate; and
 - c. submit verification of licensure from the licensing entities in all states where the applicant is currently or has ever been licensed.

Checklist of Required Documents to Submit for an Architect by Credentialing:

The following documents and additional forms are required in addition to the basic application. Some documents may be submitted directly by the applicant as part of the application. Others, such as transcripts, may need to be sent to the board directly from the source.

- Official license verification from states and jurisdictions in which the applicant holds or has ever held a professional license of any type;
- NCARB Council Record submitted to the Board office.
- Applicant applying due to a terminated license status. If so, must reapply for licensure and submit a current NCARB Council Record and verification of previous licensure from the licensing entities in all states where the applicant has been licensed.

Application Fee(s) for an Architect by Credentialing:

The following fee(s) must be submitted with your application. Online applicants can pay using a credit card or e-check. If you submit a paper application you must submit a check. Do not mail cash.

- \$180 – (\$100 application fee and \$80 license fee. Must be submitted together.)

You can apply for a license online at <https://ebiz.mt.gov/POL/> or download a paper application from the website. Online application is recommended.
