

LICENSING REQUIREMENTS AND APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Land Surveyor Intern Certificate Applicants

Below are the minimum requirements you must meet to sit for the Fundamentals of Surveying (FS) licensure exam administered by the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES.) Certification as a Land Surveyor Intern does not authorize the holder to practice as a Professional Land Surveyor.

NOTE: An applicant who has already passed the NCEES FS exam prior to application is not required to take the exam again as part of their application process.

- 3 references, at least 1 from a U.S.-licensed Professional Land Surveyor <u>MCA 37-67-326</u>, <u>ARM 24.183.503</u>
- For applicants who apply under the experience-only pathway: at least 2 and not more than four exhibits of land surveying projects with written narratives accompanying each. At least 1 exhibit shall demonstrate the applicant's knowledge of the principles and practices of boundary surveying -- <u>MCA 37-67-326</u>, <u>ARM 24.183.505</u>

Additional Materials Required

Educational transcripts (if required by licensure pathway) If applying through an education pathway that is not pre-approved by the board, include descriptions of all land surveying courses, noting whether your instructor was a licensed professional land surveyor.

Exam verifications (if FS exam was taken and passed in another state)

Official license verifications from states and jurisdictions in which the applicant holds or has ever held a professional license of any type

If you answered "Yes" to any personal history questions, include a detailed explanation on the event(s) and documentation from the source (licensing board, federal agencies/programs, or civil/criminal court proceedings such as initiating/charging documents, final disposition/judgement documents, etc.).

Fees assessed by NCEES are not collected by the Board.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Land Surveyor Intern Applicants

- Except for third party character references, hand-written documents from the applicant will not be accepted.
- Applications determined to be complete are reviewed by the Board's executive staff and may require full Board review during a public meeting.
- Land Surveyor Intern certificates are valid for a maximum of two years. They may be renewed for additional two-year periods at a cost of \$25 per renewal. The deadline for renewal is June 30.
- Review the Montana laws & rules regarding the practice of land surveying in Montana. License and certificate holders are bound by the laws & rules under the Board.
- If you are applying with land surveyor education that is not already pre-approved by the Board you must complete the education summary form including whether or not the courses were taught or supervised by a licensed Professional Land Surveyor.
- If you are applying with one of the following education credentials, you do not need to submit course descriptions and instructor information:
 - A.A.S Degree in Surveying, Flathead Valley Community College
 - o Minor in Land Surveying/LS Certificate, Montana State University-Bozeman
 - A Civil Engineering Technology degree with Land Surveying Certificate from Montana Technological University

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

- Following initial review, additional information may be necessary for processing. If so, further information on deficient or missing items will be requested via email.
- Some applications require review by the Board at a public meeting.
- Inform the Board office of any address or name changes. Maintenance of accurate contact information makes timely processing and subsequent licensure possible.

(<u>MCA 37-67-313</u>)

37-67-326. QUALIFICATIONS OF APPLICANT FOR EXAMINATION AND CERTIFICATION AS LAND SURVEYOR INTERN. (1) An applicant who meets any of the following sets of requirements must be admitted to the fundamentals of surveying examination:

(a) a baccalaureate degree in land surveying that meets the board-approved land surveying curriculum, passage of the fundamentals of surveying examination, and references as required by the board;

(b) an associate degree in land surveying that meets the board-approved land surveying curriculum, passage of the fundamentals of surveying examination, and references as required by the board;

(c) a baccalaureate degree with a minor in land surveying that meets the board-approved land surveying curriculum, passage of the fundamentals of surveying examination, and references as required by the board; or

(d) before October 1, 2022, passage of the fundamentals of surveying examination, at least 6 years of combined office and field experience in land surveying under the direct supervision of a licensed professional land surveyor of which at least 4 1/2 years must be progressive experience in charge of land surveying projects, and references and exhibits as required by the board.

(2) Upon passage of the fundamentals of surveying examination, an applicant must be granted a certificate as a Montana land surveyor intern.

(3) Certification as a land surveyor intern does not authorize the holder to practice as a professional land surveyor.

The following is language taken from two Board of Professional Engineers & Professional Land Surveyors administrative rules that, together, define land surveying experience. 24.183.303 DEFINITIONS

(11) "Progressive land survey experience" means experience obtained under the supervision of a licensed professional land surveyor, on land surveying projects, which, over time, are of increasing quality and require greater responsibility, and which must include experience with the Public Lands Survey System (PLSS) and Bureau of Land Management Manual of Survey Instructions, and may include one or more of the following:

(a) experience with aliquot part subdivision of sections, retracing existing boundaries, establishing new boundaries, corner search and reestablishment, research existing public records, survey computations, preparation of legal descriptions, certificates of survey, subdivision plats, corner recordation forms, exhibits, and other documents pertinent to such work; or
 (b) experience teaching advanced undergraduate or post-graduate land survey courses offered as part of a board-approved curriculum.

24.183.502 APPLICATIONS

(1) Applicants shall complete all experience required for approval of an application: prior to submission of an application; or at a time approved by the board.

24.183.504 EXPIRATION OF APPLICATIONS

(3) Applications in which the applicant does not already possess the experience required for licensure or approval to take an examination are incomplete and will not be accepted.

The practice of professional engineering and land surveying is regulated by statute in Montana for the protection of the public against incompetent or unscrupulous persons in accordance with Chapter 37, Title 67, Montana Code Annotated.

37-67-301. License required to practice or offer to practice. In order to safeguard life, health, and property and to promote the public welfare, any person in either public or private capacity practicing or offering to practice engineering or land surveying shall hereafter be required to submit evidence that he is qualified so to practice and shall be registered as hereinafter provided. From and after January 1, 1958, it shall be unlawful for any person to practice or to offer to practice in this state engineering or land surveying, as defined in this chapter, or to use in connection with his name or otherwise assume, use, or advertise any title or description tending to convey the impression that he is a professional engineer or a professional land surveyor unless such person has been duly registered under the provisions of this chapter.

37-67-101. Definitions. As used in this chapter, the following definitions apply:

(5) (a) "Practice of engineering" means:

(i) any service or creative work the adequate performance of which requires engineering education, training, and experience in the application of special knowledge of the mathematical, physical, and engineering sciences to the services or creative work as consultation, investigation, evaluation, planning and design of engineering works and systems, planning the use of water, teaching of advanced engineering subjects, engineering surveys, and the inspection of construction for the purpose of ensuring compliance with drawings and specifications;

(ii) any of the functions described in subsection (5)(a)(i) that embrace the services or work, either public or private, in connection with any utilities, structures, buildings, machines, equipment, processes, work systems, projects, and industrial or consumer products or equipment of mechanical, electrical, hydraulic, pneumatic, or thermal nature insofar as they involve safeguarding life, health, or property.

(b) The term includes other professional services necessary to the planning, progress, and completion of any engineering services.

(c) The term does not include the work ordinarily performed by persons who operate or maintain machinery or equipment, communication lines, signal circuits, electric power lines, or pipelines.

37-67-101. Definitions. As used in this chapter, the following definitions apply:

(6) "Practice of land surveying" means any service or work, the performance of which requires the application of special knowledge of the principles of mathematics, physical sciences, applied sciences, and:

(a) the principles of property boundary law to the recovery and preservation of evidence pertaining to earlier land surveys;

(b) teaching of land surveying subjects;

(c) measurement and allocation of lines, angles, elevations, and coordinate systems;

(d) location of natural and constructed features in the air, on the surface of the earth, within underground workings, and on the beds of bodies of water, including work for the determination of areas and volumes;

(e) monumenting of property boundaries;

(f) platting and layout of lands and the subdivisions of land, including the alignment and grades of streets and roads in subdivisions; and

(g) preparation and perpetuation of maps, plats, field note records, and property descriptions.
