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## **Licensing Requirements and Application Checklist Certified Residential Appraiser by Reciprocity**

## License Requirements for Certified Residential Appraiser by Reciprocity

Below are the minimum requirements you must meet in order to be licensed in the state of Montana.

- 1. Be of good moral character [MCA 37-54-202(1)(a)]
- 2. Have an active license in good standing, as shown on the ASC national appraiser registry, from a state that has:
  - a. licensing requirements that meet or exceed those in Montana, and
  - b. a rating above a "poor" for compliance with Title XI of FIRREA as determined by ASC- [ARM **24.207.502**(4)]
- 3. Be listed as AQB compliant with CE on the ASC national appraiser registry [ARM 24.207.502(4)]
- 4. Submit fingerprints for the purpose of a fingerprint and background check [MCA 37-54-202(3)]

## Checklist of Required Documents to Submit for Application for Certified Residential Appraiser by Reciprocity
